

How to Increase Font Size


Internet Explorer 11

Zoom in on any webpage for better readability. Zoom enlarges or reduces everything on the page, including text and images.

To zoom in or out on a webpage

1. On the Start screen, tap or click **Internet Explorer** to open Internet Explorer.
2. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen, and then tap **Settings**.
(If you're using a mouse, point to the lower-right corner of the screen, move the mouse pointer up, and then click **Settings**.)
3. Tap or click **Options**.
4. Under **Appearance**, move the **Zoom** slider to increase or decrease zoom.

To zoom in or out on a webpage in the desktop

1. Open the desktop, and then tap or click the Internet Explorer icon on the taskbar.
2. Tap or click the **Tools** button , and then tap or click **Zoom**.
3. Select a predefined zoom level, or select a custom level by tapping or clicking **Custom** and entering a zoom value.

Internet Explorer 10

To zoom on a webpage

1. Open Internet Explorer.
2. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen (if you're using a mouse, point to the lower-right corner of the screen and move the mouse pointer up), and then tap or click **Settings**.
3. Tap or click **Internet Options**, and then under **Zoom**, move the slider to increase or decrease zoom.

To zoom on a webpage using Internet Explorer for the desktop


1. Open Internet Explorer for the desktop.
2. Tap or click the **Tools** button, and then tap or click **Zoom**.

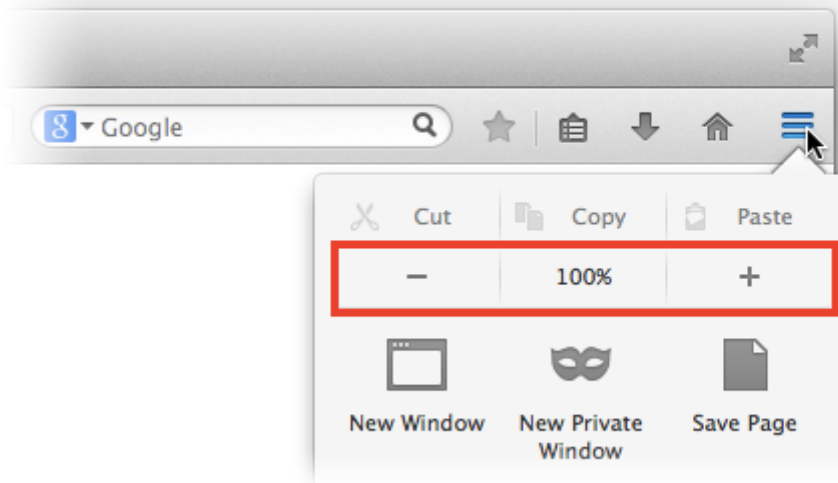
3. Select a predefined zoom level, or specify a custom level by tapping or clicking **Custom** and entering a zoom value.

Zoom in and out of a website

Here's how you can zoom in and out of individual websites.

1. Click the menu button  on the right. The customization menu will open and you will see the zoom controls at the top.




2. Use the  button to zoom in, and the  button to zoom out. The number in the middle is the current zoom level - click it to reset the zoom to 100%.

Google Chrome


How to set page zoom for all webpages





You can adjust the size of **everything** on the webpages you visit, including text, images, and videos.

1. Click the Chrome menu  on the browser toolbar
2. Select **Settings**.
3. Click **Show advanced settings**.
4. In the "Web Content" section, use the "Page zoom" drop-down menu to adjust the zoom.

How to set zoom on your current page

Use the zoom options in the Chrome menu to make everything on a webpage larger or smaller.


1. Click the Chrome menu  on the browser toolbar.

2. Find the "Zoom" section in the menu and choose one of the following options:
- Click  to make everything on the page larger. You can also use the keyboard shortcuts **Ctrl** and **+** (Windows, Linux, and Chrome OS) and **⌘** and **+** (Mac).
 - Click  to make everything smaller. You can also use the keyboard shortcuts **Ctrl** and **-** (Windows, Linux, and Chrome OS) and **⌘** and **-** (Mac).
 - To go into full-screen mode, click . You can also use the keyboard shortcuts **F11** (Windows and Linux) and **⌘-Shift-F** (Mac). If you're using Chrome OS, you can also press  at the top of your keyboard.

Safari

Zoom in on webpages using Safari

You can make text and images larger so they're easier to view.

- Make the webpage content larger:
Choose View > Zoom In, press Command (⌘)-Plus Sign (+), or pinch open on your trackpad. To make only text larger, choose View > Zoom Text Only before you zoom in.
- Set a minimum font size for webpages:
Choose Safari > Preferences, click Advanced, then select "Never use font sizes smaller than." Click the pop-up menu and choose the minimum font size you want.
- Expand to full-screen view:
Click the green full-screen button  in the top-left corner of the browser window, or press Control-Command (⌘)-F. To return to standard view, move the pointer to the top-left corner of the screen, then click the green full-screen button again, or press Control-Command (⌘)-F.
