## Are your patients eligible?

To be eligible\* for a PAN grant, your patients must:

1. Be getting treatment for the disease named in the program they are applying for.
2. Be seeking assistance for a medication or product listed on our list of covered medications.
3. Have health insurance that covers the qualifying medication or product.
4. Have an income that falls at or below the Federal Poverty Level specified by the program.
5. Reside and receive treatment in the United States or U.S. territories.

\*Certain programs may have additional requirements.
