# Are you eligible for assistance?

1. You must be receiving treatment for the disease named in the assistance program to which you are applying.
2. You must have health insurance that covers your qualifying medication or product.
3. Your medication or product must be listed on PAN's list of covered medications.
4. Your income must fall at or below 400% or 500% of the Federal Poverty Level.
5. You must reside and receive treatment in the United States or U.S. territories.
